Owning the scope, backlog and MVP of an AI agent platform is not a stretch for me, it is what I do right now. As Head of AI and product owner of an agent based platform, I translate business and product requirements into an executable roadmap, prioritize the backlog toward an achievable MVP, and hold firm scope discipline so each phase ships measurable value without drifting from the product vision. I write testable acceptance criteria, turn requirements into development ready user stories, and, because I lead the engineering side too, I know exactly what makes a story executable. Under my leadership, the company reached Registered Partner status in Anthropic's partner program.

What sets this apart from a generic product role is that I define quality where it is hardest: agent behavior. I set objective quality metrics for the agents together with engineering, using traceability and evals, and I keep a decision log of the "Manual Now vs. Automate Later" calls, deciding what to ship as human assisted first and what to automate once it is proven. On top of that I bring more than fifteen years delivering enterprise B2B technology in Agile teams, managing dependencies, incremental releases and multiple stakeholders, and aligning executive expectations up to C level, which is most of what keeps an ambitious MVP on track.

One note for context. My path runs through delivery leadership, consulting and Head of AI rather than a single long tenure under the "Product Owner" title, but the craft this role names, backlog ownership, acceptance criteria, scope decisions and executive alignment, is exactly what I practice today on a live AI product. If anything, owning both the product and the engineering of an agent platform is a rare combination for this MVP. I would welcome the chance to talk. Thank you for your time.
